Author Visit

As part of Book Week, we were visited by a NZ children's author and illustrator, **Ruth Paul**, on Wednesday 10th May. Children were thoroughly entertained and inspired by her.



Ruth spoke to the children about the stages involved when writing a book and where she got some of her

ideas. She shared with the children that she got her idea for 'The King's Bubbles,' from singing the Humpty Dumpty rhyme with her son when he was in the bath, afterwards they blew some bubbles and he called out, 'The King's bubbles.' She talked about writing long lists of words and then coming up with rhymes, for example, undies ideas: bloomers (pumas), daks (yaks) were some of her ideas for 'The Undies' Ball.'

Matai children finished their time with Ruth acting out her latest book, 'I am



Jellyfish.' Our three actors performed brilliantly and brought the story to life. Ask your child what they learnt about being an author.

Learning Conferences

Kaukau Project update

Very soon we will have more information to share about the major building project replacing the 3-storey block. The tenders have closed and the Ministry of Education is now working with successful tenderers on tag clarifications. Once the successful contractor has been confirmed, there'll be on-site meetings to establish construction, health & safety and traffic management plans. Work is likely to get underway sometime in June.

Kowhai Refurbishment

Next week tenders will open on the Government Electronic Tender Service (GETS) for refurbishment of the big Kowhai block (main entry, toilets and break out spaces). Families of Y1 children will be aware that the girls' toilet and withdrawal space were damaged during a flood in late January. Since that time we have been working with the school's property consultant, an architect and the Ministry of Education to develop plans to modernise the area, create more teaching and learning space and upgrade toilets.

125th Celebration

In 2018 we celebrate our 125th jubilee! We are planning celebrations for Labour Weekend 20-22 October next year to coincide with the completion of the major building project.
